Defibrillator Training



The Parish Council have recently replaced the broken defibrillator on Occupation Road/Main Street. A second one is located at the junction of Main Street and the A447. We have arranged an East Midlands Ambulance Service community responder to provide training on using a defibrillator successfully. Its something we all hope, we will never have to do, but by giving emergency first aid (CPR and Defibrillator) to someone suffering a cardiac arrest can increase their chances of survival from 6% to 74%......

No experience required. He will give step by step training on how to use them.
