Firstly we are delighted to welcome Claire Bonshor as a parish councillor. She is a well known member of the village and brings fresh ideas, many talents and great all round community attitude to strengthen the council.

The September meeting was very well attended by parishioners. We received a presentation from JBM solar farms who are submitting a planning application shortly to HBBC for the mation of a solar farm at land called Stoneshollow, between Nailstone and Barlestone. Many questions have been raised by councillors and parishioners. When responses are received we will post them on our website for all to see. The Parish Council cannot make any formal comments or representation until the application is received for consultation from HBBC.

We have also been working closely with community groups and village representatives to celebrate Christmas! It was agreed to fund Christmas trees to display in Church Meadow, and install an electric supply for future events.

We have purchased a replacement Defibrilator as the one on Occupation Road could not be brought back to life! Thankyou to Anthony the community First Responder for sorting this so swiftly. He has agreed to provide a training session at Dovebank School, to anyone interested in learning how to use it... (Further details to follow)

We have captured many vehicles & have collated the figures by day & time period to help the police target their monitoring in the village more effectively. We are working with the Parish Council and Cllr Bertie Harrison Rushton to carry out speedwatch in the village and continue with capturing the HGV offenders
