As the summer draws to an end and the children return to school we are pleased to report that overall anti-social behaviour and other summer related issues were lower than previous years. Our attention for the month ahead will no doubt include visits to local schools to remind parents of the importance of parking safely. This month we as a beat have received - 434 calls, 61 of these were 999 calls. An array of incidents were reported, some calls being - 22x ASB, 32x Assaults, 4x Drug offences, 12x Burglaries, 3x Hoax calls and 17x Wildlife incidents.

CANNABIS FACTORY FOUND IN DESFORD

Officers attended an address in Desford and were surprised when 3 people jumped out of a window and ran off. They were more surprised to find a large cannabis grow hiding inside, all ready to be harvested. After the property was made safe by electricians approximately 466 plants and a substantial amount of dried buds were seized along with paraphernalia and equipment. This quite a substantial set up with a street value of around half a million pounds and leaves us thinking how they managed to set everything up without local residences becoming suspicious. There have been a number of house fires as a result of these kind of set ups so it is so important that if you have any suspicions you report them to us. This investigation continues.....

Community Consultation

YOU SAID, WE DID:

BAGWORTH - You reported issues with Lorry's breaching the weight restrictions in Bagworth, contact has been made and work is ongoing to identify and deal with offenders. We are also working with the local council to resolve this issue. An operations with the support of our volunteers will take place next month. We will continue to patrol in this area and take action when offences are witnessed.

MARKET BOSWORTH – Reports were made of youths gathering in the carpark of Bosworth Hall close to the gym. Patrols have been increased resulting in 6 stop searches being completed, cannabis seized and a knife being located in the area. We are continuing to patrol this area and are working closely with the staff at the gym.

GROBY – Reports of anti-social behaviour in the area with large groups of youths gathering and being rowdy. In conjunction with the local parish council we have identified hotspots leading to the removal of a bench that appeared to be a focal point for groups meeting up. Work is ongoing with local stores to ensure alcohol is not being sold to minors. A number of section 59 warnings have been issued to youths identified and patrols continue.

NEWBOLD VERDON – Reports of anti-social behaviour and drug use in the area with a focus on the pavilion. We have increased our patrols in this area resulting in some individuals being stopped and searched and a quantity of drugs being seized. We have also as a result of intelligence conducted a warrant at an address in the area where cannabis was found to be growing. We will continue to patrol this area and deal with offenders accordingly.
